In the academic year 2014-15, well equipped ICT class room has been introduced for PG/ UG classes. The methods of old teaching have been dropped and modern methods of teaching and learning was adopted. These initiatives have largely impacted on the students learning broadly i.e. understanding of the course work, developing thinking pattern and enhancing specialized skills.
